How about a relaxing boat cruise? Head out to Rockwall Harbor, Harbor Lights, for an hour and thirty minute dinner cruise for \$50 every Friday night at 7:30pm. If you're looking for a daytime cruise, You don't need to travel across the ocean to experience a beautiful gondola cruise. Visit the Los Colinas canals where Dallas Classic Gondola Cruise will take you on a scenic canal tour starting at \$150 for 2 Adults.





Not looking for a relaxing vacation? Head over to Arlington to seek out your greatest adrenaline thrills at Six Flags Over Texas and Hurricane Harbor. Cool down on the Log Ride, test your limits on Runaway Mountain or Mr. Freeze: Reverse Blast, visit Bugs Bunny's Boomtown for kid-friendly rides and a chance to meet many of the Looney Tunes characters or take in any of the live shows offered throughout the park! MEASURING THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION EXPENDITURES

The 2018 Pensionomics study analyzed data on specific private sector pension plans (referred to as "multiemployer plans") to assess the overall national economic impact of benefits paid by these plans to retirees.

We estimate the employment, output, value added, and tax impacts of pension benefit expenditures from multiemployer plans at the national level, and find that the economic gains attributable to private sector multiemployer defined benefit pension expenditures are considerable.

In 2016, \$41.8 billion in pension benefits were paid to 3.5 million retired Americans covered by multiemployer plans. The average benefit paid to retirees covered by these plans was \$11,935 per year.

Expenditures made out of those pension payments collectively supported:

- Nearly 543,000 American jobs that paid nearly \$28 billion in labor income
- \$89 billion in total economic output nationwide;
- \$50 billion in value added (GDP); and
- \$14.7 billion in federal, state, and local tax revenue.

Death benefit pension expenditures have large multiplier effects:

- Each dollar paid out in pension benefits supported \$2.13 in total economic output nationally.
- Each taxpayer dollar contributed to state and local pensions supported \$8.48 in total output nationally. This represents the leverage afforded by robust long-term investment returns and shared funding responsibility by employers and employees.
- The largest employment impacts occurred in the real estate, food services, health care, and retail trade sectors.
