If you're looking for a daytime cruise, You don't need to travel across the ocean to experience a beautiful gondola cruise. Visit the Los Colinas canals where Dallas Classic Gondola Cruise will take you on a scenic canal tour starting at \$150 for 2 Adults.



Not looking for a relaxing vacation? Head over to Arlington to seek out your greatest adrenaline thrills at Six Flags Over Texas and Hurricane Harbor. Cool down on the Log Ride, test your limits on

Runaway Mountain or Mr. Freeze: Reverse Blast, visit Bugs Bunny's Boomtown for kid-friendly rides and a chance to meet many of the Looney Tunes characters or take in any of the live shows offered througout the park!
