### How is the COLA Percentage Determined?

A Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) is an annual increase added to the base pension of each eligible retiree and beneficiary. Your base pension is the pension you received at the time of your retirement.

Each year the COLA is calculated two ways and based on the greater of either:

- The percentage of change in the price index for October, over October of the previous year up to 3%. for Tier B members and 5% for Tier A members or
- The percentage of the annual average change in the price index for the latest 12 months available, up to 3% for Tier B members and 5% for Tier A members\*.

Should the COLA calculation equal 0%, there will be no COLA increase for the year. To find out which tier you are in, **CLICK HERE**.

#### HOW YOUR COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT (COLA) IS CALCULATED

Each year that ERF calculates a COLA is to be paid, that amount will be added to your base pension to determine your new pension amount for the year. The COLA goes into effect annually on January 1.

You will not receive any COLA during your first calendar year of retirement. During your second calendar year of retirement, any COLA will be prorated. After that, you will receive the full COLA if a COLA is due.

For example, if you retired on July 15, 2022, you would not receive any COLA in 2022.

On January 1, 2023, you would receive one-half of the 2023 COLA (because you were retired during one-half of 2022). In 2024, you would receive the full COLA (because you were retired during all of 2023).

An example of a typical COLA calculation for a retiree is someone that's been retired since 2012 with a base pension of \$2,968, their current pension is \$3,469, and the current COLA is 2.923%.

The formula for the COLA would be as follows:

\$2,968 - Base Pension x 2.923% = \$86

\$86 + \$3,469 - Current Pension = \$3,555 - New Pension


\* Tier A members began their employment with the City before January 1, 2017 & Tier B began their employment with the City after January 1, 2017.
