## Mobile Unit Makes doing Business with the City Easy for Citizens

"City Hall on the Go!," the City's specially equipped van, is now rolling through Dallas providing a variety of services to residents in their neighborhoods.

The new mobile office gives citizens the opportunity to conduct city business like paying a water bill, taking care of outstanding tickets or looking up a warrant and paying it online. There's also a walk-up window to ask questions or voice concerns.

The technology window offers a mobile hotspot and free access to an Android tablet, iPad, and laptop. A shaded awning provides respite from the Texas sun. City staff are available to help citizens with the on board technology.

"City Hall on the Go!, can provide any of the services that 311 offers over the telephone," said Community Engagement Coordinator Stephen Walker. "We can help people get birth certificates, garage sale permits, adopt a pet or register their animals." You can also report potholes, loose dogs, code concerns or illegal dumping.



City Hall on the Go is available for events such as neighborhood association meetings to make communities aware of 311 services and inform the community about city government services.

The mobile unit gives all Dallas citizens the chance to connect face to face with City Hall.

"This is more of a one-on-one experience for those who want to learn about what their local government can do for them and what their options are. They're going to get an extra level of customer care," Walker said.

# Air Travel ID Requirements Change in 2018

Beginning in January 2018, driver's licenses from some states will be rejected as a form of identification for boarding an aircraft.

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) has been gradually implementing the REAL ID Act passed by Congress in 2005. TSA has announced that starting next year it cannot accept some state driver's licenses because they don't meet current, acceptable security standards.

The state of Texas driver's license *is compliant* with the REAL ID Act.

But, the residents of the following nine states must use a passport or some other government-approved identification.

- Kentucky
- Maine
- Minnesota
- Missouri
- South Carolina

Oklahoma

Pennsylvania

- souri
- Montana
- Washington

Several other states have been granted extensions while they prepare to comply with the requirement.

The REAL ID Act was based on recommendations of the 9/11 Commission to guard against terrorist attacks.

# Help ERF Support a Local Charity



# Monthly Pension Statement Now Available Online

**ERF will stop printing pay stubs in February 2018** to reduce cost and increase efficiency for our members.

After the last paystub is mailed to you in December, you will be able to view your monthly payment online with a myERF account. Your previous monthly pension statements are already available online for members who have signed up for a myERF account.

If you have not created your myERF account, follow these instructions to log in and view your monthly statement;

- 1. Go to the ERF website, www.dallaserf.org.
- 2. In the green retiree, box click "register."
- 3. Fill in the registration form (You must input your account # to complete your registration. Your account # is on your monthly paystub.)
- **4.** Scroll to the bottom of the registration form and click to Accept the Terms of Conditions and Use
- 5. Click "Create an Account."
- **6.** Once you have successfully created an account you can log into your account anytime by clicking "Log In," in the upper right of the ERF website.
